Note. Regarding licensure in the state of Illinois, Associate Marriage and Family Therapists were not eligible to sit for the AMFTRB licensing exam until they had completed their clinical hours for licensure which is no sooner than two years after their eligible master's degree has been conferred. This restriction was updated in June 2018 and now students are eligible once they have their ALMFT. Notes on graduation rates are provided in the table. Data provided for job placement rate is defined as the percentage of graduates from the cohort year listed that are employed within three years of their graduation utilizing skills learned in the COAMFTE accredited program. Data for the national exam pass rate is of those current students and graduates who have sat for the exam. A number of CFTD students matriculate into the program with a master's degree in art therapy, counseling, or social work and subsequently decide to maintain their licensure and chose not to pursue licensure as an LMFT though their primary identity is of a Couple and Family Therapist.
