Why is Higher Education in Prison (HEP) Important?

HEP matters not only to incarcerated people, but also to society.

Impacts Families Positively

Children with parents that have a college degree are more likely to attend college.



Increases Employment Opportunities

Postsecondary education in prison increases employment and earnings for formerly incarcerated people, most of whom will leave prisons and jails and return to their communities.



Empowers Students to Give Back

Students in HEP programs report greater wellbeing. Many students go on to form advocacy groups to give back in their communities benefiting all people in Illinois.



Creates Opportunities for Individual and Community Transformation

Higher education helps incarcerated and formerly incarcerated students develop and share their unique and valuable insights with the world.

IL-CHEP Priorities

- Support programs and instructors that offer higher education to people in prisons.
- Participate in, and advocate for, research and educating the public.
- ▶ Establish clear and consistent policies regarding access and administration of higher ed across facilities.
- ▶ Focus on higher education as a significant path toward reentry.
- Disseminate college and career resources to incarcerated and formerly incarcerated students.
- Advocate with state entities for access to IDOC data related to HEP.
