This sequence ensures students take all prerequisite courses, that full time status is maintained (enrolled in 6 credits or in practicum), and that Adler University is able to plan course offerings each term. Students are required to consult with their Faculty Advisor to confirm course selections including a plan for electives prior to registration for each semester. The MCFT program is a full time 60 credit program to be completed in two years and no longer than five years. The Certificate in Sex Therapy is a 10 credit program to be completed within or in addition to the 2 years for the fulltime MCFT. The 10 credits can also be used to meet the electives for the MCFT.

\*Pre-requisites for Practicum - These courses are pre-requisites to beginning the clinical practicum (foundational practice component). Students who do not earn a “B” or better in these courses must retake them, postponing the start of practicum and extending the overall length of the degree.

~Additionally, MCFT-505, MCFT-510, MCFT-572, and MCFT-651 are prerequisites to take MCFT-660 and MCFT-662 in the spring semester. Students will be assessed for readiness to apply to practicum in MCFT-510 and MCFT-514 across fall and spring courses and instructors. All students will begin clinical practicum at the start of their second year and will register for a total of nine credits of practicum (MCFT-603, MCFT-604, MCFT-605, and MCFT-606).

\*\* Students enrolled in the Certificate in Sex Therapy (CST) do NOT take MCFT-653 (removed from this AAS) and have six credits of electives that can be counted for both the Certificate and/or the MCFT for a total of 64 credits to complete the MCFT and the CST together.

\*\*\* MCFT + CST students can take additional electives (see Appendix A for list) above and beyond both program requirements for a total of up to 70 credits.

Students may also choose to take MCFT-870: International Immersion and Cross Cultural Studies (3 credits). The CFT Department’s goal is to offer MCFT-870, the Study Abroad opportunity, on an annual basis. Professor, location of travel, length of trip, and additional costs, and the semester offered may vary each academic year. Students are also assessed a \$400 fee when registering for this course. Additionally, if there is insufficient student interest to support the course, it may be cancelled.

NOTE: Not all electives are offered every academic year and minimum enrollment numbers must be met otherwise the course will be cancelled. If students continue into the PhD program, electives completed for the MCFT cannot be transferred into the CFTD.

MCFT-670 and MCFT-655 must be taken concurrently with CFT clinical practicum. Continuous enrollment in CFT Practicum and Practicum Seminar (MCFT-607) is required until the necessary client contact hours for degree completion are met. This may also increase the overall program credits and delay degree conferral. Students take the MAQE concurrent to their last semester in clinical practicum.

The department reserves the right to make changes to the curriculum or curriculum sequence in the best interest of the student with adequate notification.

**Professional Development – Self-of-the-Therapist**

The mission of the MCFT program is to train quality couple and family therapists firmly grounded in systemic theories who are culturally competent and socially responsible. To bring the curriculum, social justice lens, and clinical practicum experience together, the CFT program attends to self-of the-therapist growth and development throughout the curriculum and specifically in the following course sequence:

Orientation -> 510 -> 514 + 660 -> 600 -> Practicum Seminars -> 512 -> Capstone Project

Because of this sequence, students cannot transfer in any of these courses, but may use a transferred graduate level equivalent to these to meet the program’s elective requirement following the university’s transfer policies. For example, if a student is transferring in a Diversity course, that can meet the 3 credits of elective, but they must still take MCFT-660 in our department.

NOTE: Students are required to fill in the following information as degree requirements are completed. This is a record that is maintained both by the department in the student’s digital file and recommended to be maintained by the student and submitted to their faculty advisor each semester.

### Capstone Project Completion

The Capstone Project has two components – the MAQE and the Professional Portfolio. Both will be completed as part of MCFT-512 and are described in the course syllabus. Students who are not yet in the last semester of their clinical practicum, will take an incomplete in MCFT-512 to completed the Capstone Project concurrent to completing practicum.

### Part I: Master of Arts Qualifying Exam (MAQE)

The MAQE is a comprehensive examination at the culmination of students’ training in the CFT Program at Adler University. It is an evaluation of the students’ competencies on the program’s Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs) 1 through 7. The MAQE is a four-hour, 200 question, multiple-choice exam that mimics the AMFTRB exam for licensure. Results are provided immediately after each attempt and 75% is considered passing.
